


A DRAWING COMPETITION was organised by the WEST CENTRAL RAILWAY WOMEN WELFARE ORGANIZATION.


DIWALI CELEBRATION

- Visitors are restricted to enter into the school premises without entry at the reception.








The school library is accessible for all the students, in a streamlined manner. The school is in process of procuring books for the library. Renovation of school library is streamlined to be completed by December 23.




The Labs are fully equipped with necessary material / apparatus.




DISCIPLINE

The general discipline of the school has been satisfactory. There were cases in which the students were involved in indisciplinary acts, as mentioned below:

- A case of indisciplinary act was taken up by the School Discipline Committee. A student of class XII was caught taking out Rs. 200/- from another student's bag. The parent of the miscreant student was called to the school and the matter was brought to their knowledge.
 The matter was resolved and an apology letter was submitted by the parent.
- A student of class VIII was castigated for misbehaving with the teacher. Her parents were
 called and were told about her misconduct. She was warned that if she does not change her
 attitude then she will be punished for the act.

• In another incident, an ex-student was caught on the CCTV camera when he was damaging (pulling out) the same camera. He was identified and was called to the school along with his parents. He accepted his mistake and was given a stern warning.




STAFF MEETINGS

A special staff meeting was called to discuss about the Annual Function of the school scheduled on 26 November 2022.






REPORTING MATTERS
