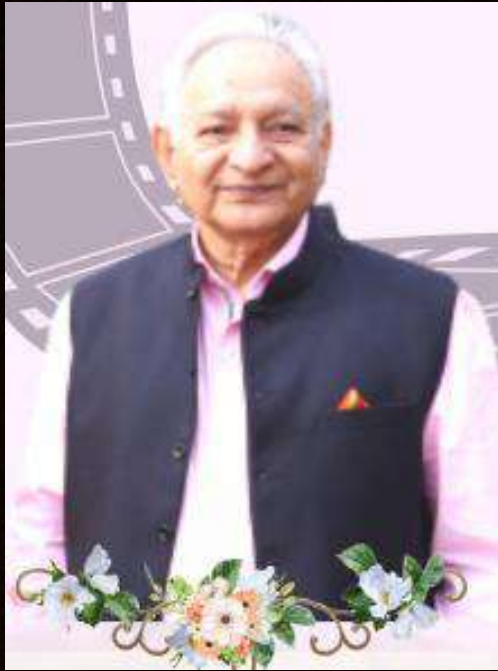

While the recent wave of Covid-19, ravaged the entire nation, we could hardly imagine that it would meet out such a heavy blow to Child Education Society (CES).

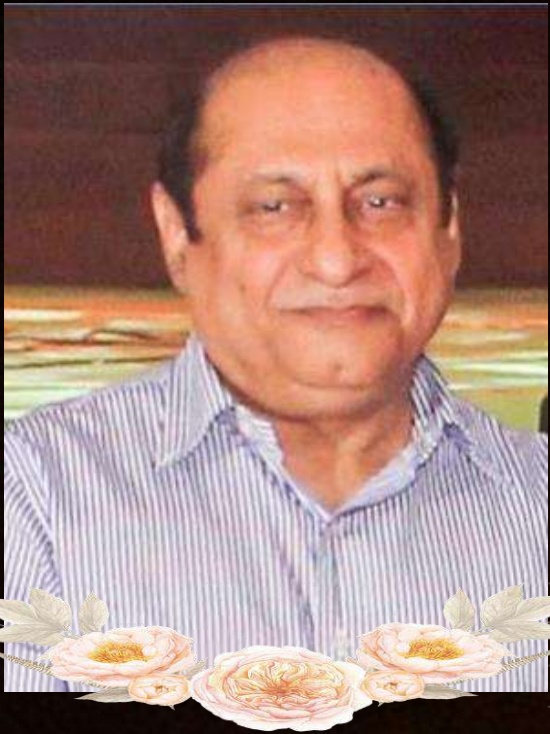
CES lost its stalwarts whose noteworthy contributions had led the Society to grow from a single school to its present glorious conglomerate of 27 nationwide schools.

He was a true **KARAMYOGI**, whose contributions to the cause of education shall forever be cherished.



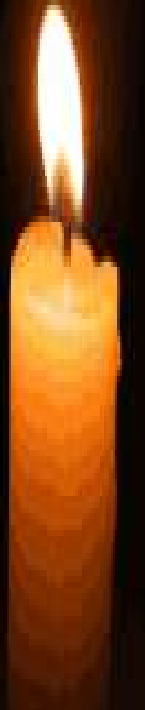


**Dr V . K. Ahuja, Vice President, CES**

**A founder member of the Child Education Society and its Vice President, Dr. Ahuja has been a strong support to the Society's educational endeavors.**



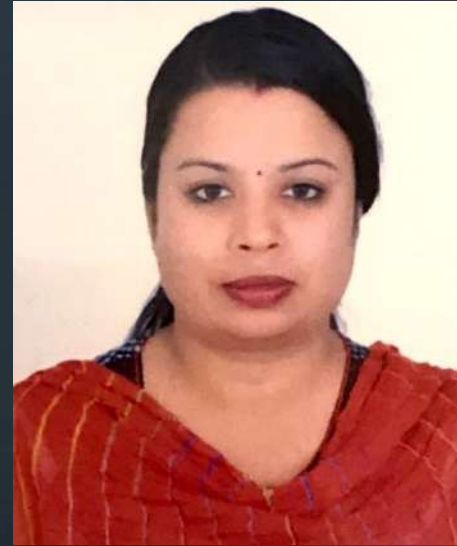


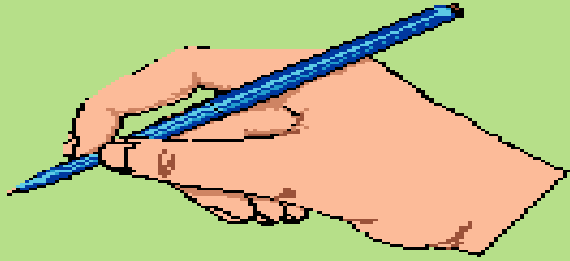

## STAFF MATTERS FOR THE PERIOD FROM 21 MAR, 2021 TO 30 JUL, 2021

### LEGAL PROCEEDINGS:

- Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, Ex-PRT (Music) has lodged a case in Labour Court of Bhopal to release his payment of gratuity and leave encashment. Based upon the Enquiry Report of the disciplinary proceedings, he was terminated from his services on 30 May, 2016. It was mentioned in his termination letter to clear all his pending dues after obtaining clearance certificate from the School. Mr. Mukesh, inspite of 3 gentle reminders sent by the School did not respond and hence the school did not release his full and final dues.
- The principal in person has been attending all the hearings. The details of the hearings are as follows-
  - **First Hearing- 17 Feb, 2021**- The Advocate at Bhopal has submitted the reply to the Labour Court in response to the petition received by the School. Next date of hearing was 7 April, 2021.
  - **Second Hearing- 7 April 2021**- Due to Covid-19, the case was adjourned. Next date of hearing was 3 June 2021.
  - **Third Hearing- 3 June 2021**- Due to Covid-19, the case was adjourned. Next date of hearing is 6 August 2021.

विषयांतर्गत संदर्भित विभागीय समसंख्यक परिपत्र दिनांक 09.12.2020 एवं 22.12.2020 का कृपया अवलोकन करें। उक्त परिपत्रों के माध्यम से कोविड-19 महामारी के कारण लॉकडाउन अवधि में तथा उसके पश्चात् गैर अनुदान प्राप्त अशासकीय विद्यालयों की शैक्षणिक सत्र 2019-20 एवं 2020-21 की फीस के भुगतान के संबंध माननीय उच्च न्यायालय मुख्य खण्डपीठ जबलपुर द्वारा याचिका क्रमांक 9293/2020 एवं अन्य समरूप प्रकरणों में पारित निर्णय दिनांक 04.11.2020 के पालन के अनुक्रम में दिशा-निर्देश जारी किए गए थे। साथ ही परिपत्र दिनांक 01.03.2021 द्वारा शैक्षणिक सत्र 2021-22 के संबंध में निर्देशित किया गया था कि अशासकीय विद्यालय प्रबंधन द्वारा सत्र 2020-21 हेतु यथा सूचित एवं नियत की गई फीस का अभिभावकों द्वारा देय समय अनुसार भुगतान किया जाना होगा।

- **Session 2021-2022 commenced from 5 April 2021. Virtual classes were functioning as per the time-table schedule.**
- **Classes I to V had their 1<sup>st</sup> Block Test and classes VI to XII had their Pre- Mid Term Examination beginning from 3 July 2021 to 10 July 2021. PTM for the same was scheduled on 17 July 2021.**

**The online exams were conducted by Objective Assessment. Google form and Google classroom have proved to be effective tools.**

- **Online classes are being organized through Google Meet and Google Classroom as per the time table to continue the hassle-free teaching learning process from classes I to XII since April 2021.**

- As per the guidelines received from M.P Education Department, online classes were brought to a halt and summer vacations were declared from 1 May 2021 to 31 May 2021 which were then extended upto 30 June 2021. Further online classes were resumed from 16 June 2021 for all the classes.
- **Virtual Class Observation**. In order to improve the teaching-learning process, classes are being observed on a regular basis by the Principal.

### **Class – X**

## HOLI CELEBRATION

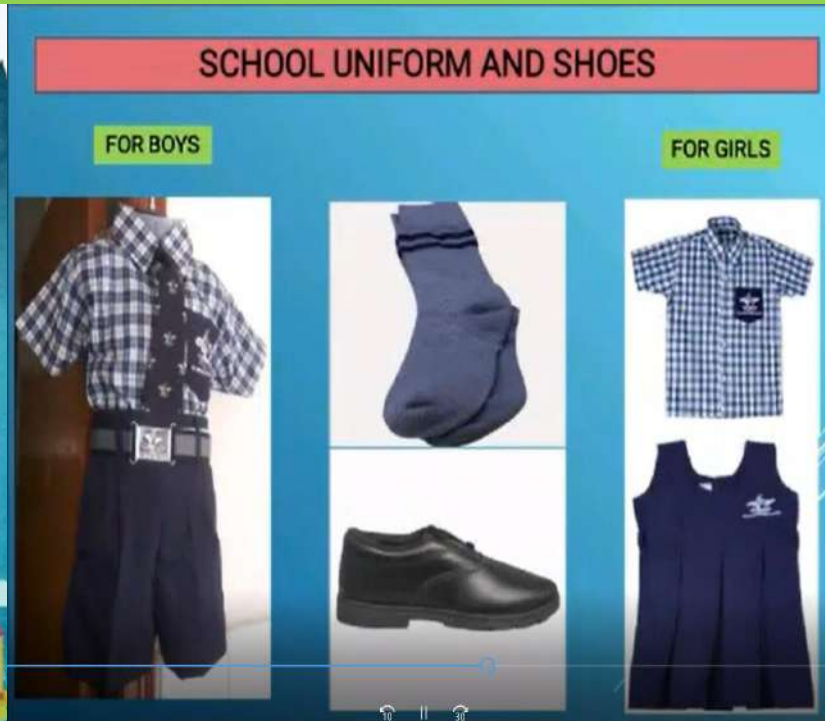

## ORIENTATION DAY

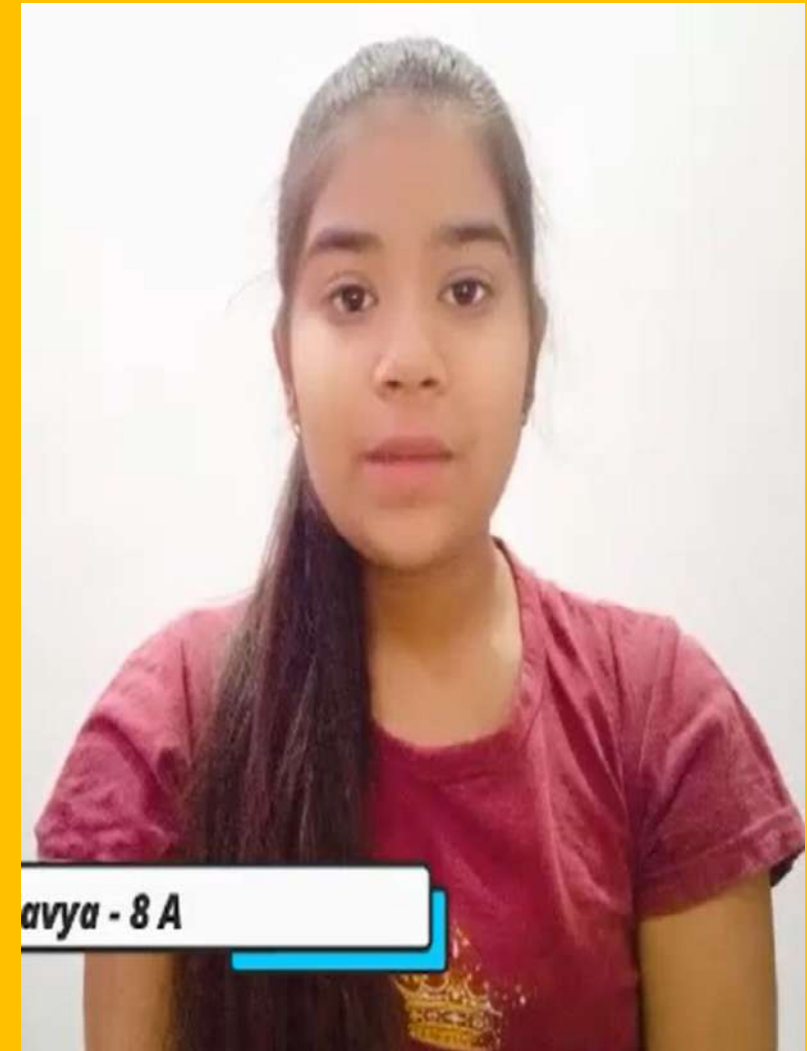

## EID-UL- FITR CELEBRATION

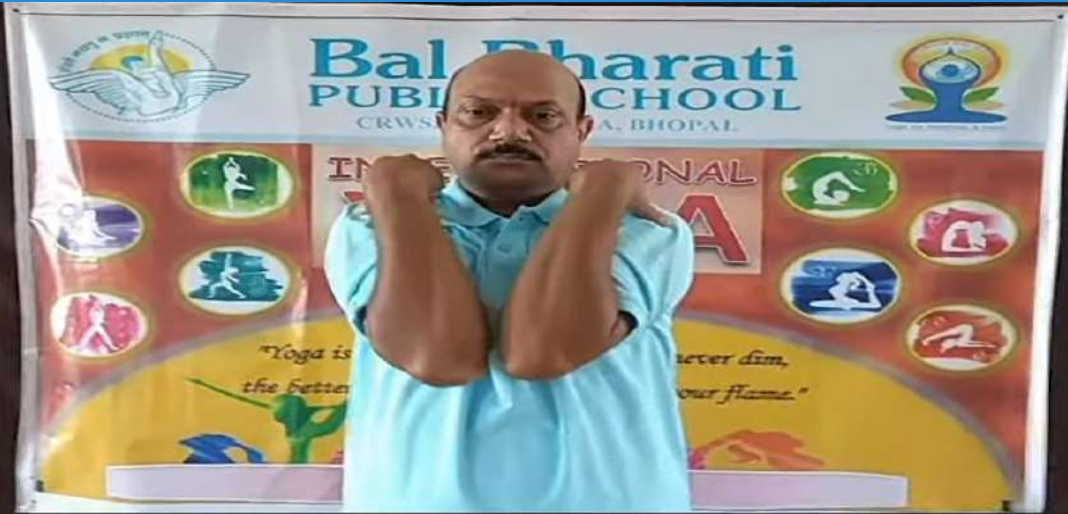
An online assembly was conducted on the feast day. Students presented speeches and prayed to God to protect the humanity from all the diseases and disasters.

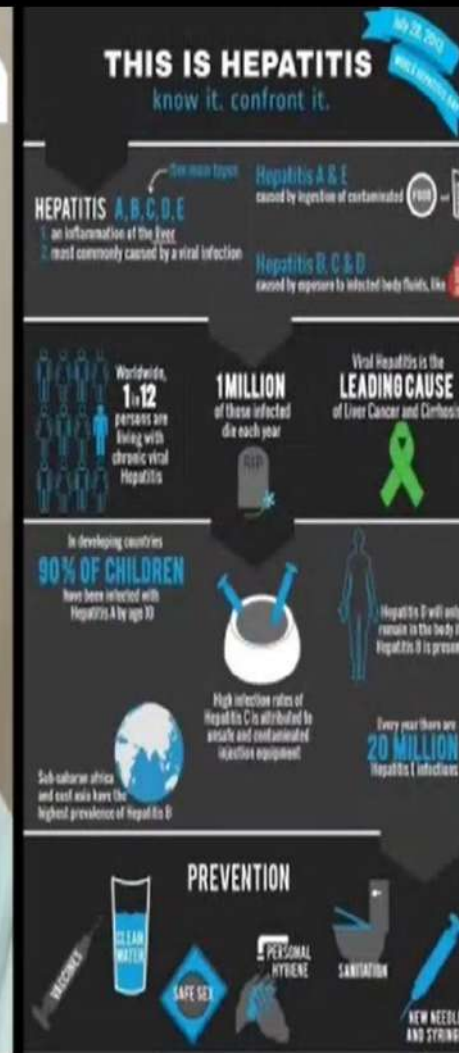
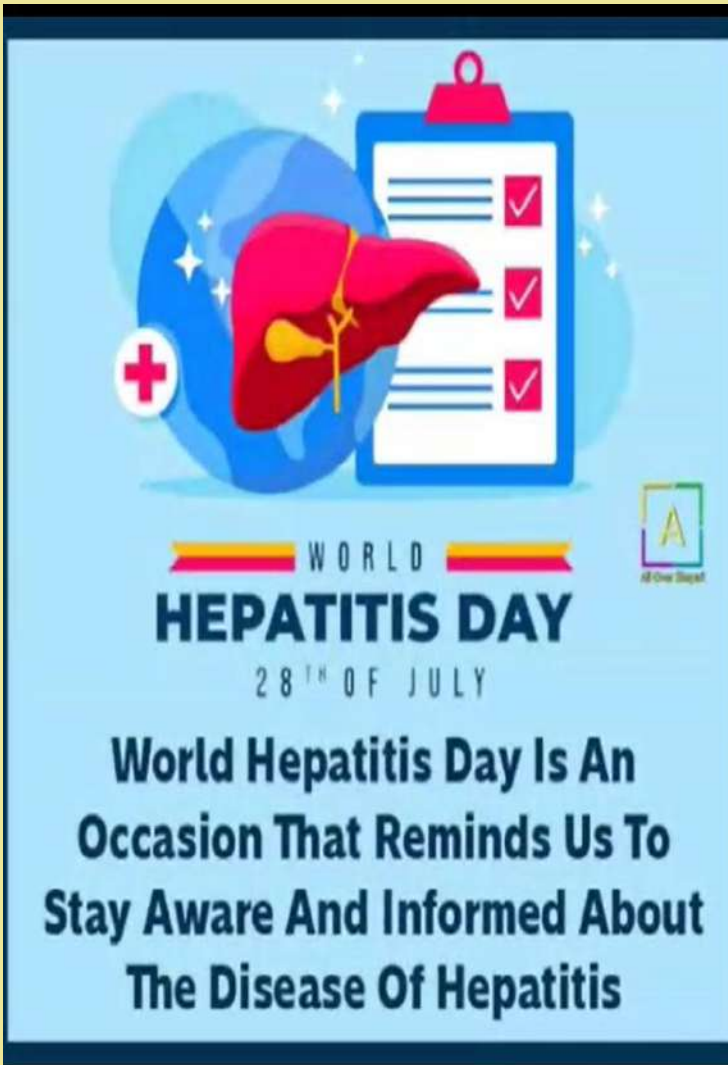
## NELSON MANDELA DAY (18 July)

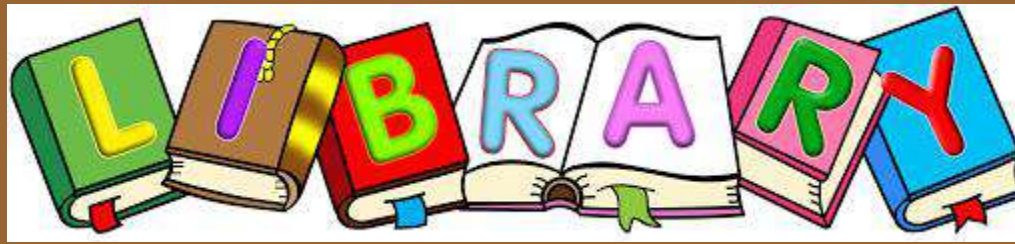

Two sweepers, one gardener and one peon are working in the school at present. P.E.T- Mr. Deepak Dhote is appointed as supervisor to supervise their work.



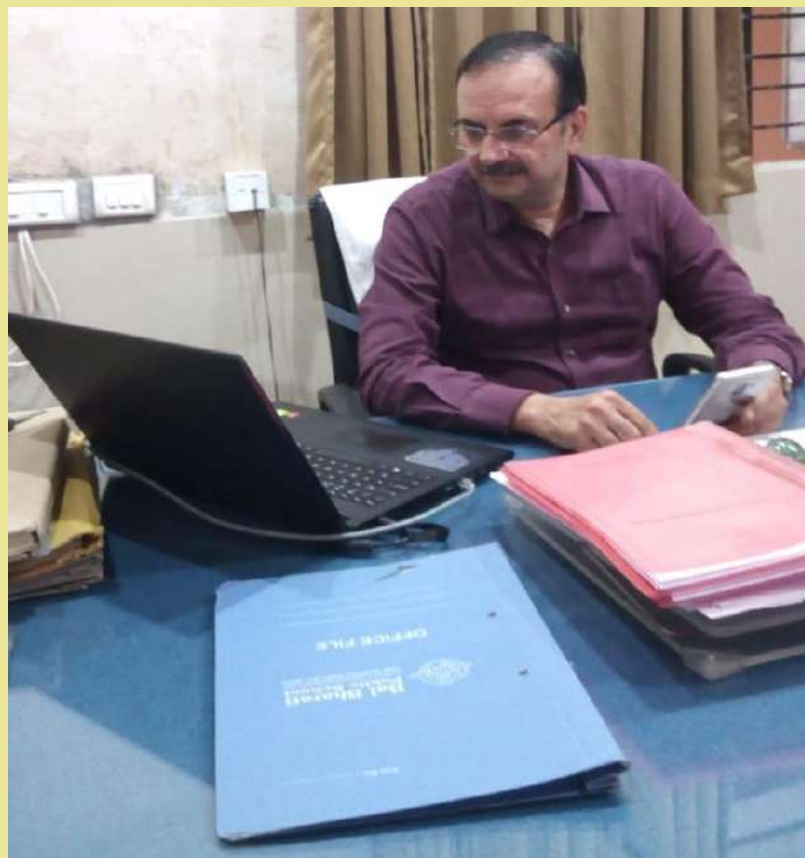


## 18. DISCIPLINE.
