

CASE I

• Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, Ex-PRT (Music) has lodged a case in Labour Court of Bhopal to release his payment of gratuity and leave encashment. Based upon the Enquiry Report of the disciplinary proceedings, he was terminated from his services on 30 May, 2016. It was mentioned in his termination letter to clear all his pending dues after obtaining clearance certificate from the school. Mr. Mukesh, inspite of 3 gentle reminders sent by the school did not respond and hence the school did not release his full and final dues.

As advised by Mr. Nikhil Channa, President, CES, we have submitted the cheque in respect to the gratuity amount (Rs. 2,79,764/- dated 31 May 2023) of Mr. Mukesh Tiwari in the court on 12 June 2023.

The court has rendered its final decision regarding the case.

• On 19 July 2023, we had received a letter (dated 11 July 2023) from the Court Controlling Authority, Gratuity Payment and Assistant Labour Commissioner, Bhopal Division, which was the final judgment of the court.

The judgement mentioned that the applicant, Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, comes under the category of employee under the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 and the amount of gratuity is payable to him under Section 4 and Section 7(3) of the said Act.) (a) are eligible to receive interest amount at 10 percent simple interest rate therefore the school owes to pay him a payment of Rs. 1,93,503/- towards interest amount. Cheque in respect to the same amount has been forwarded for approval form the competent authority.

CASE II

• Another case has been lodged by Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, Ex-PRT (Music) in the Court of III Additional District Judge, District Court, Bhopal, claiming that his termination was baseless since he is unsatisfied with the decision of the court of VIth Civil Judge, Class II, Bhopal, taken earlier in the 31 January 2018.



SPECIAL INITIATIVES

Innovative Pedagogical approach is being implemented by our teachers encouraging students to be proactive to research, explore and use multiple strategies to come out with novel ideas and strategies to uncover something new.

Music Art integration

Students of class III were engaged in an exercise that combined studying Hindi lesson with music. The music teacher composed a song on the lesson, making it enthusiastic for the students to learn.



Dance Art integration

In dance, rhythm plays a crucial role. Just as the answer to the question in a mathematical problem renders the entire problem incorrect, so does dance, if the rhythm is even slightly off. Children who are skilled in arithmetic are also good dancers and have a good sense of rhythm. How much space should be left between two dancers, how long to wait between steps, and how to stand in relation to the music. We can comprehend dancing in the context of mathematics through all of these factors.



SHIN Program

Our school has introduced Shin Program, A Japanese-style Experiential Holistic Learning Program in our school for the students of classes I to V.

We have received the activity kits and training to use the same had been convened on 1 July 2023 for the teachers teaching classes I to V. Through this training course, the teachers learned how to use the programme in the classroom and get a practical understanding of how to utilize this program in the classrooms.




