CASE I

- Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, Ex-PRT (Music) has lodged a case in Labour Court of Bhopal to release his payment of gratuity and leave encashment. Based upon the Enquiry Report of the disciplinary proceedings, he was terminated from his services on 30 May, 2016. It was mentioned in his termination letter to clear all his pending dues after obtaining clearance certificate from the school. Mr. Mukesh, inspite of 3 gentle reminders sent by the school did not respond and hence the school did not release his full and final dues.
- The principal in person has been attending all the hearings. The details of the hearings are as follows-

The case is fixed for final judgement. Dates for next hearing will be intimated by the court.

CASE II

- Another case has been lodged by Mr. Mukesh Tiwari, Ex-PRT (Music) in the Court of III Additional District Judge, District Court, Bhopal, claiming that his termination was baseless since he is unsatisfied with the decision of the court of VIth Civil Judge, Class II, Bhopal, taken earlier in the 31 January 2018.

Notice had been received from the Court of III Additional District Judge, District Court, Bhopal dated 15 December 2021 stating the date of hearing i.e. 25 February 2022.

- **Seventh Hearing-** On the hearing on 24 November 2022, the original record from the record room was not obtained by the court. Next date of hearing is 19 December 2022.
- **Eighth Hearing-** On the hearing date on 19 December 2022, the court proceedings were not held as the Judge was on leave. Next date of hearing is 28 January 2023.
- **Nineth Hearing-** On the hearing on 28 January 2023, the original record from the record room was not obtained by the court. Next date of hearing is 21 March 2023.
- **Tenth Hearing-** On the hearing on 21 March 2023, the court was closed due to strike. Next date of hearing shall be intimated later.

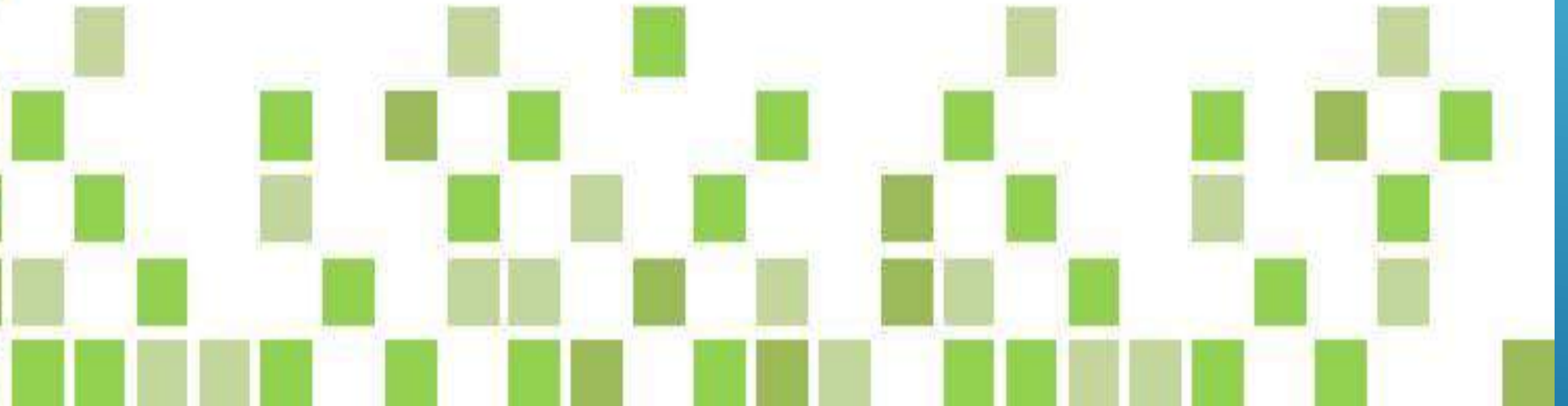

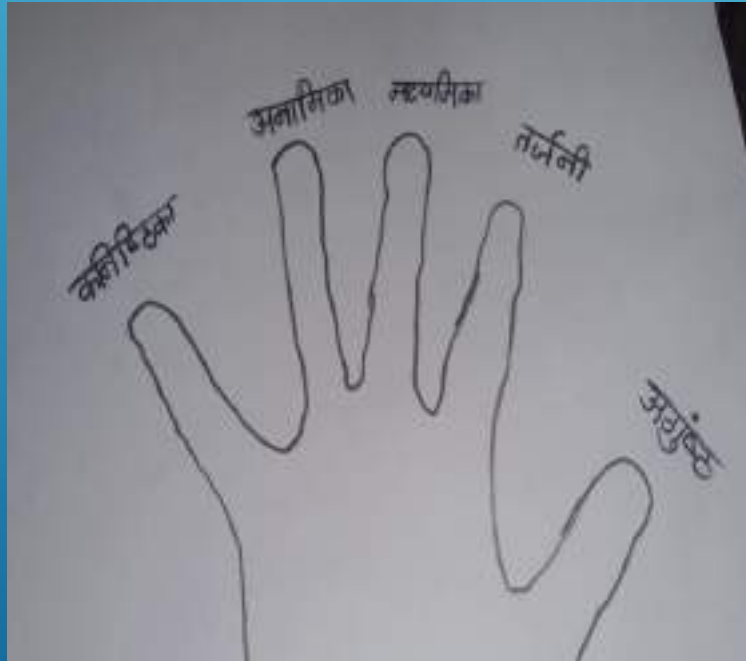
Music Art integration

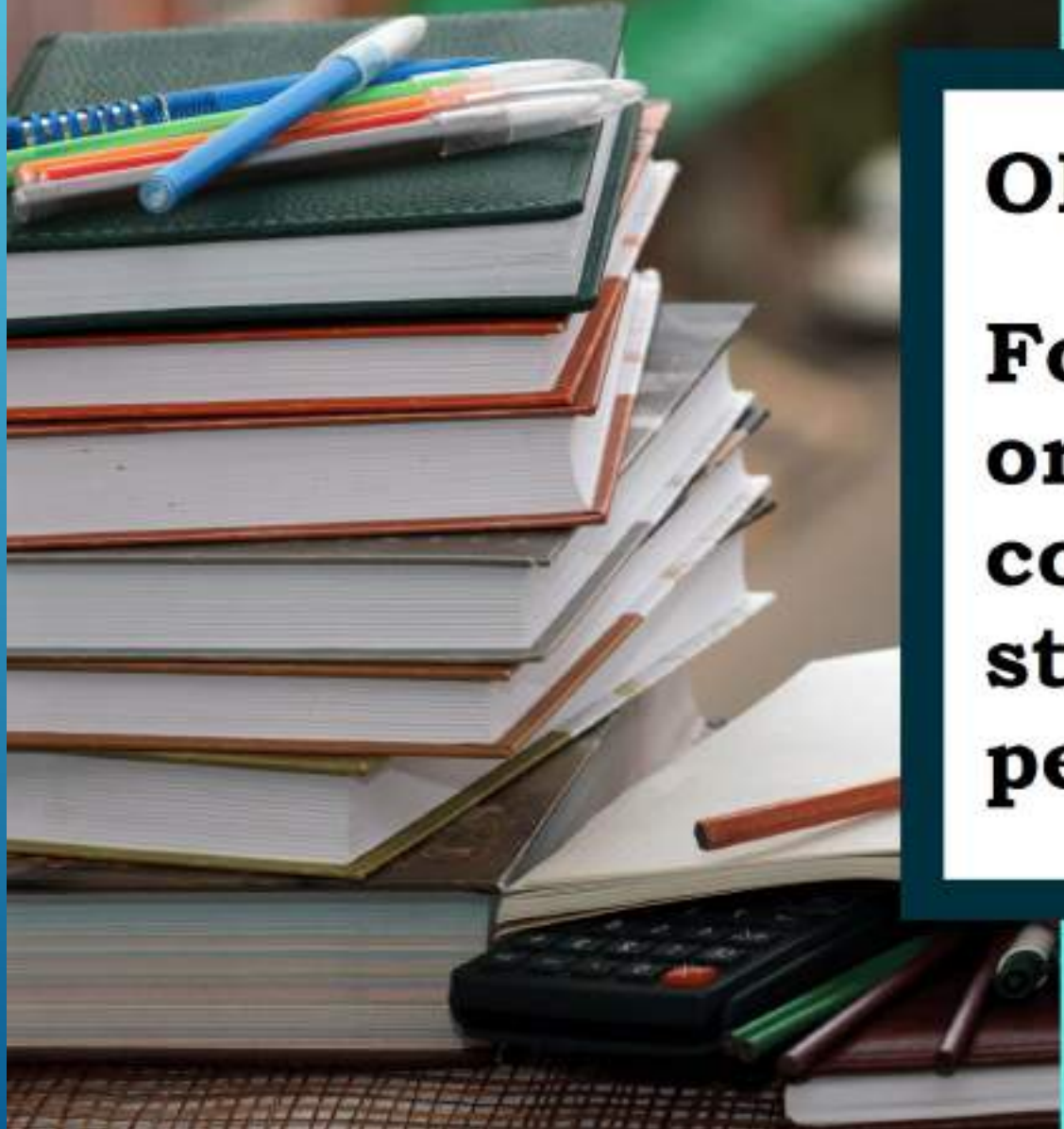

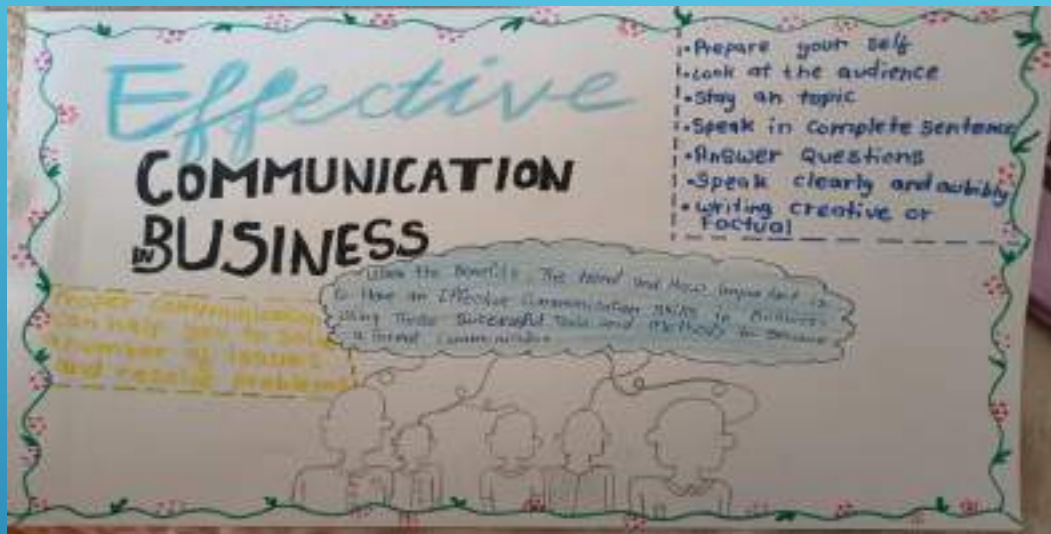

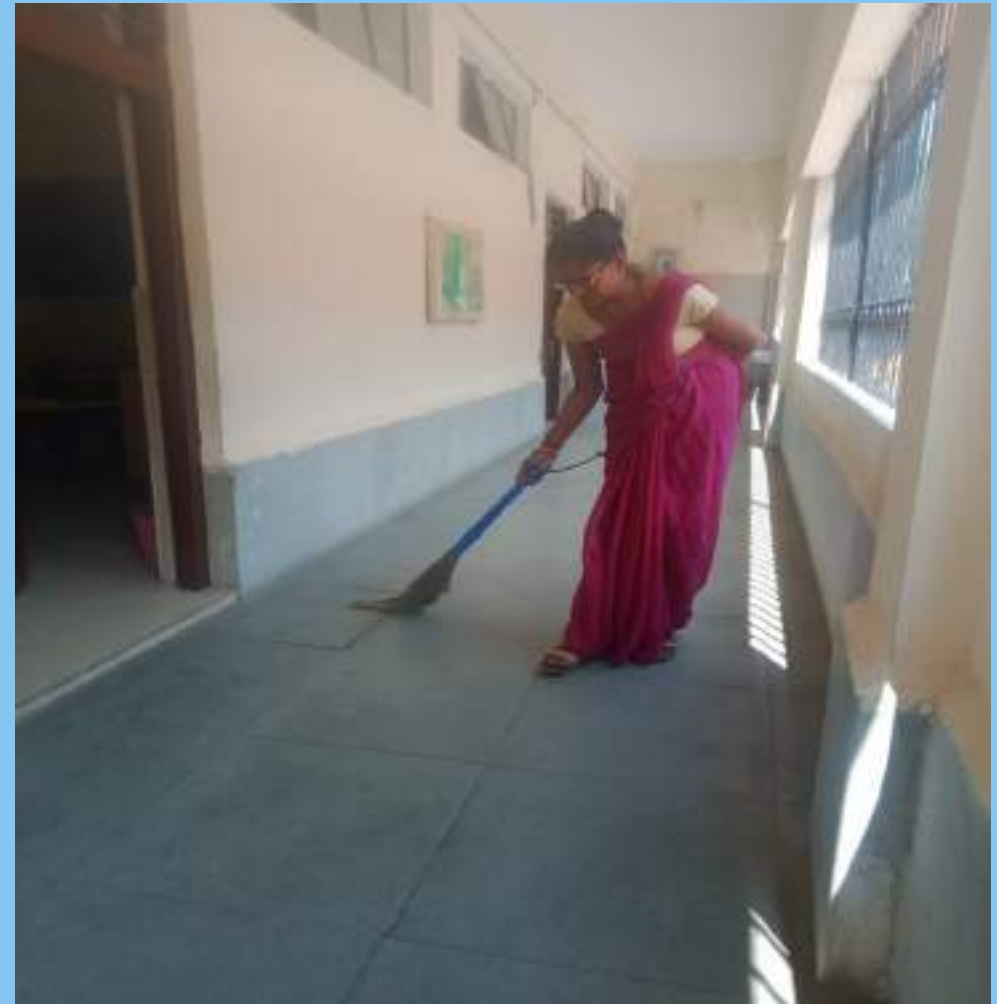
The students with age group upto 6 years were vaccinated with measles-mumps-rubella vaccine with the consent of their parents.
