Academics

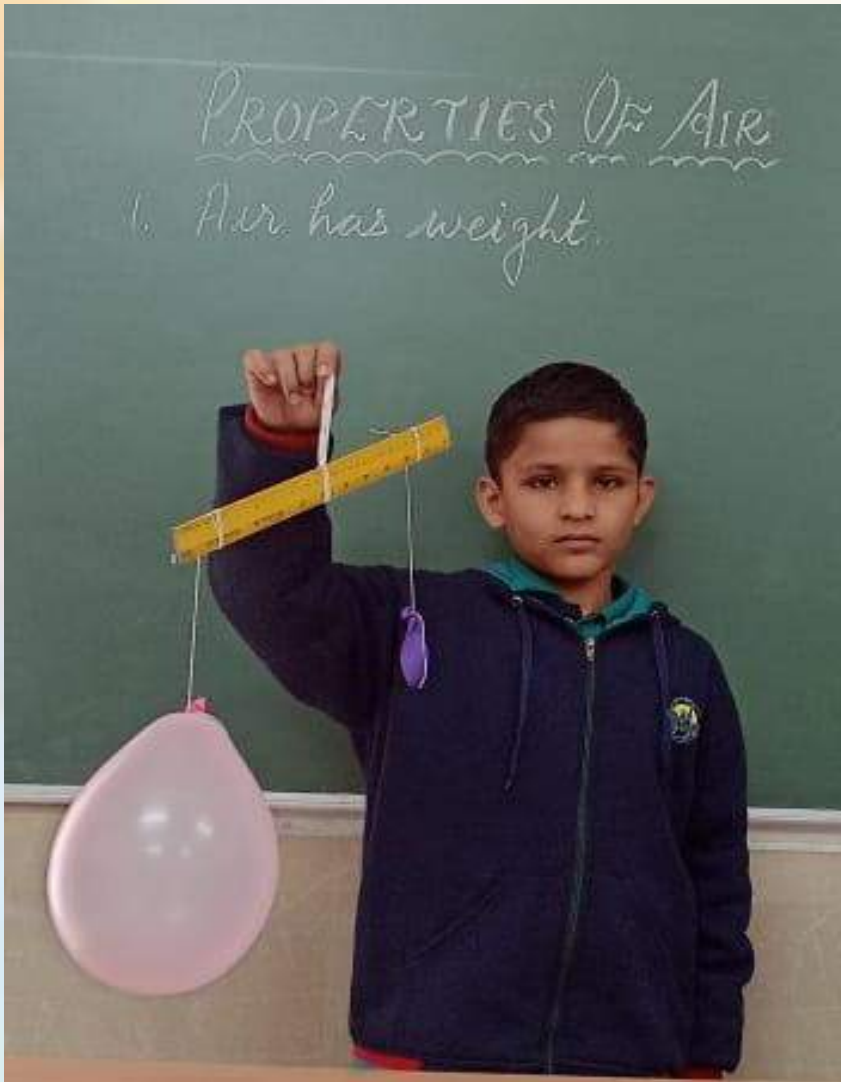

National Level Science Talent Search Examination 2023-24 was organised for classes VI to XII on 15 December 2023. 136 students participated in the exam. Result awaited.



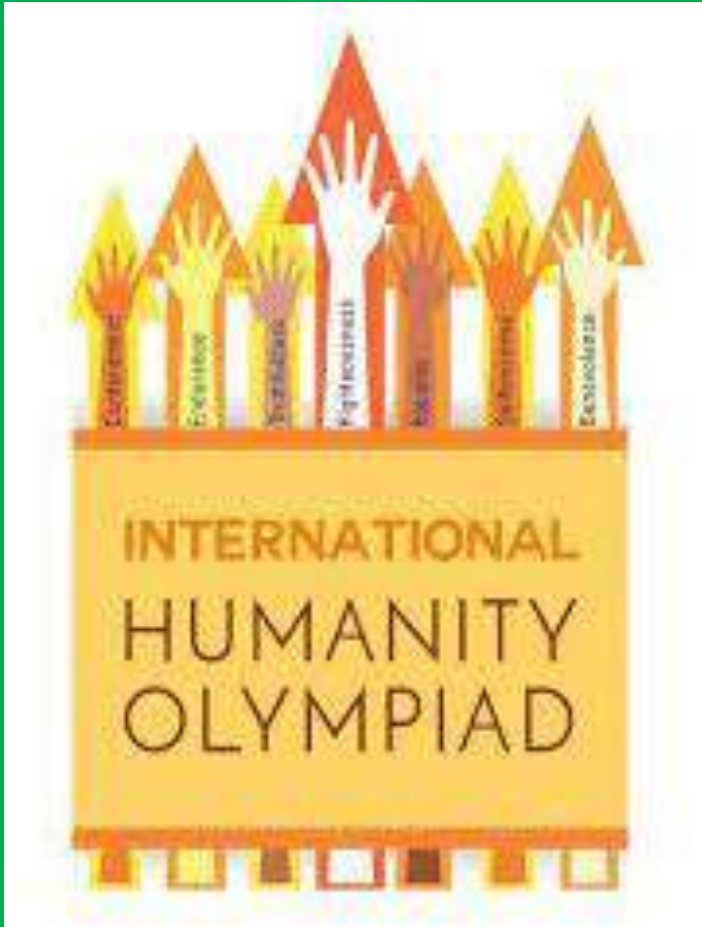

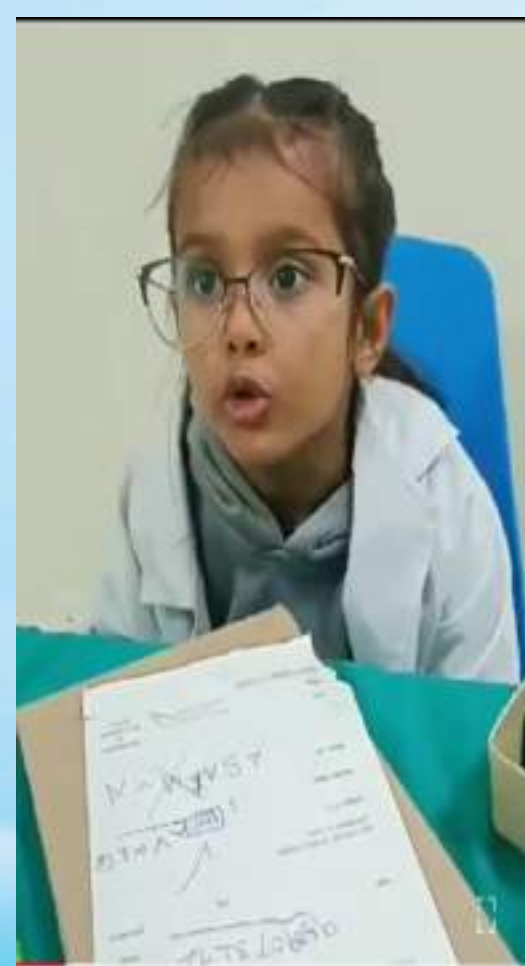

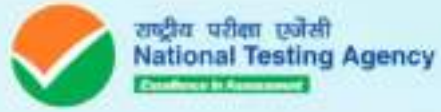

Work carried out by Railway-

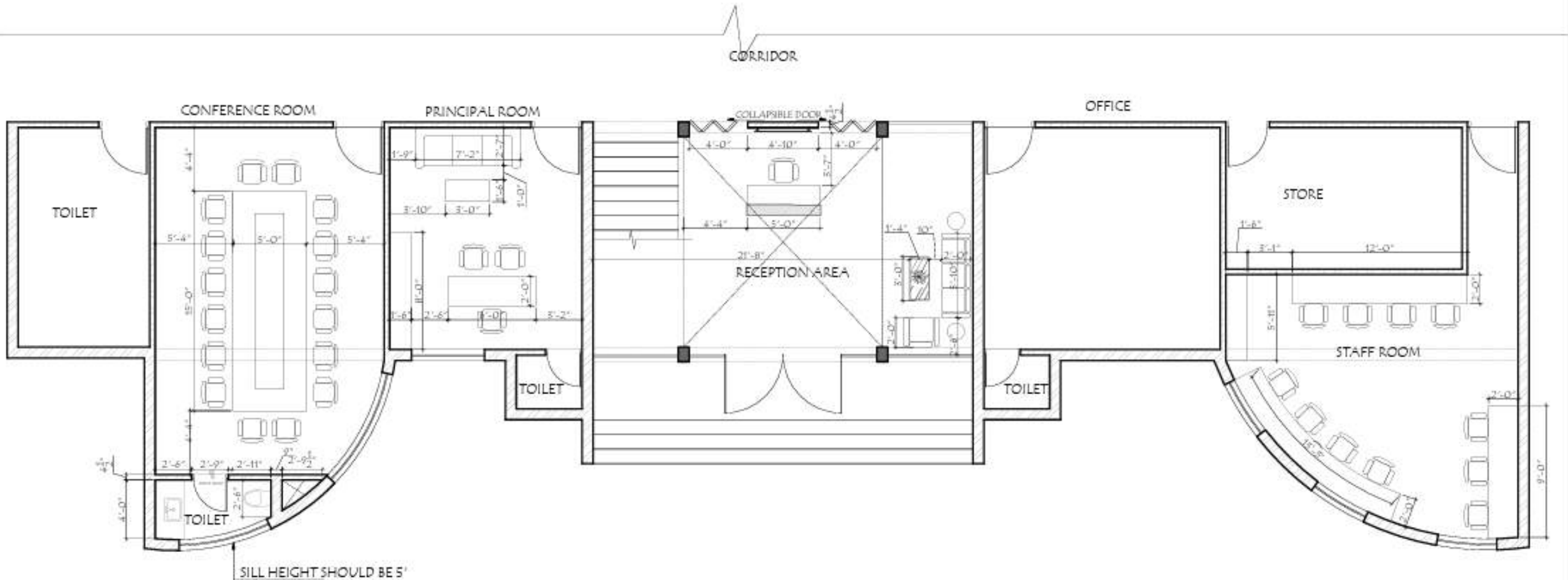
The railway officials along with the civil contractor visited the school site for measurement of the area where the badminton hall would be constructed. The construction of badminton hall is in progress.

The renovation work to be done in the school, reception area, conference room etc have been approved by the school chairman and secretary. Estimates for the same is awaited.






STAFF MEETINGS
