It is my pleasure to welcome you all to the 79th Meeting of the School Managing Committee.

The report covers the period from 1 December 2024 to 23 March 2025.



The school has 1235 students (Boys- 706 and Girls- 529) of which the wards of Railway employees are 655, 479 students are of Non-Railway wards and 09 are staff wards. Also, the school caters to the education to 92 EWS students under the RTE Act.

Our teachers have adopted an innovative pedagogical approach to encourage students to be proactive in their research, study, and use multiple tactics to come up with creative ideas and strategies to reveal something new.

Origami activity was organised for class II students. By incorporating origami activities into the classroom students could develop a wide range of skills, from fine motor skills and problem-solving to creativity, self-expression, and social-emotional learning.



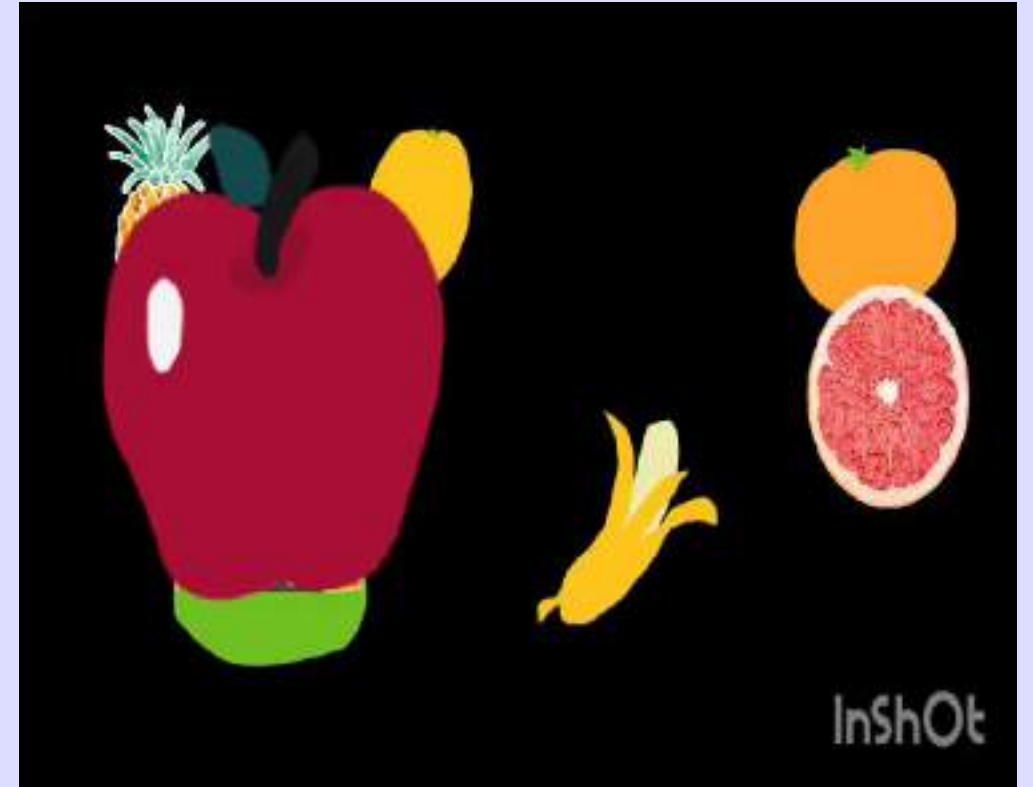
In Class III, antonyms were taught through a fun song using word pairs like "big-small" and "happy-sad." Singing with actions kept students engaged and helped them easily understand and remember opposites, making learning enjoyable and interactive.



To make learning interactive and enjoyable, an art activity was conducted in Class I while teaching the chapter "Tumbler of Oil." The children were encouraged to create drawings of tumblers. This activity not only enhanced their understanding of the story but also nurtured their artistic skills and imagination. The session was concluded with a discussion on the importance of focus and carefulness, making learning fun.



A fun-loving activity of learning the fruits name through song was conducted in class I. This activity made it easier for the students to remember fruit names also improving the pronunciation.

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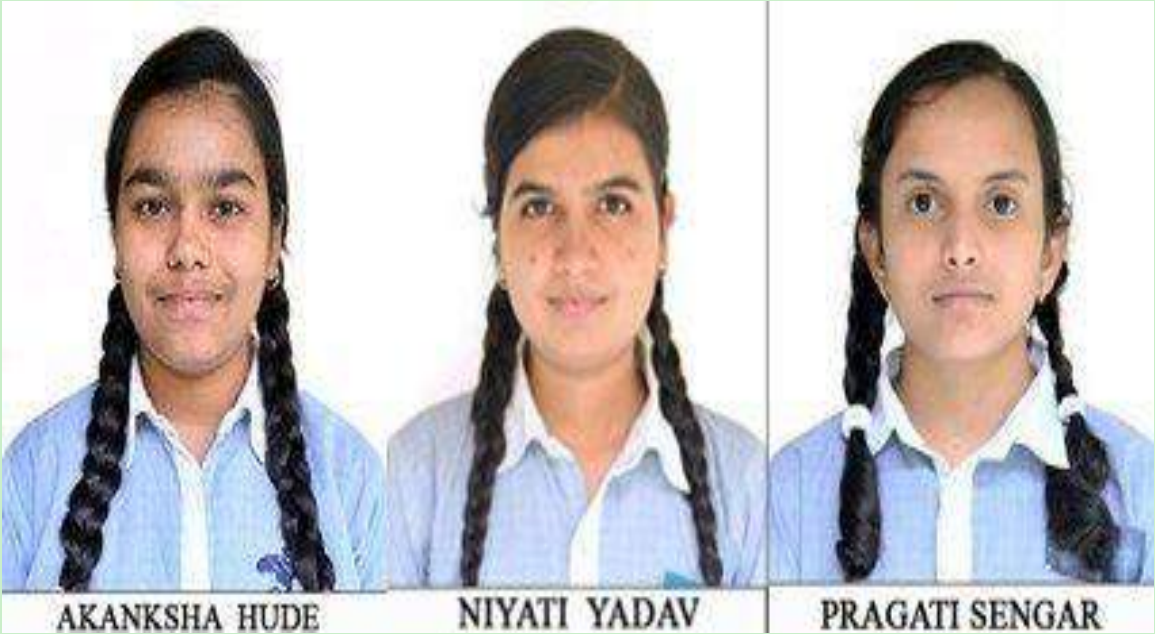

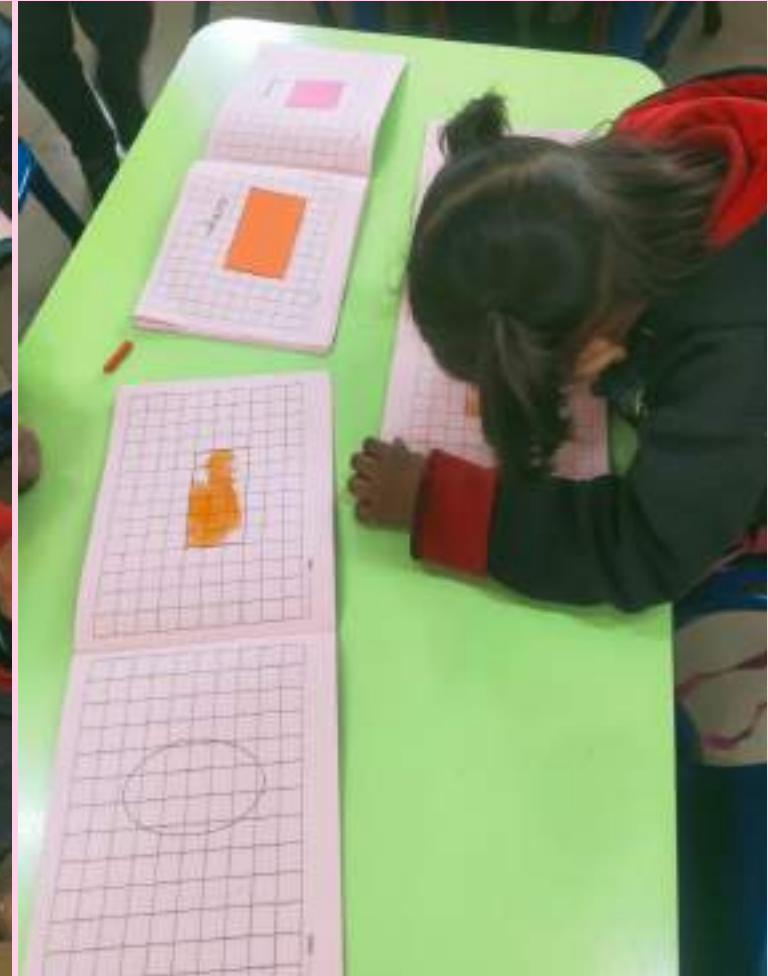
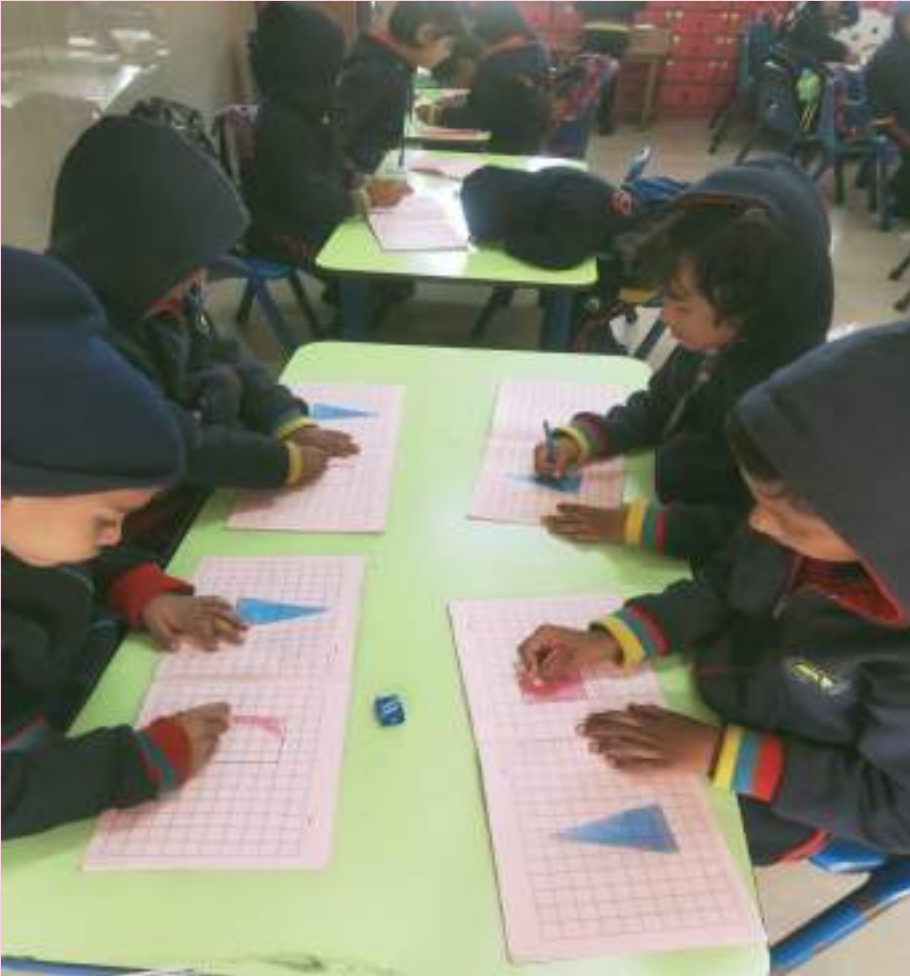


PRE-SCHOOL AND PRE-PRIMARY

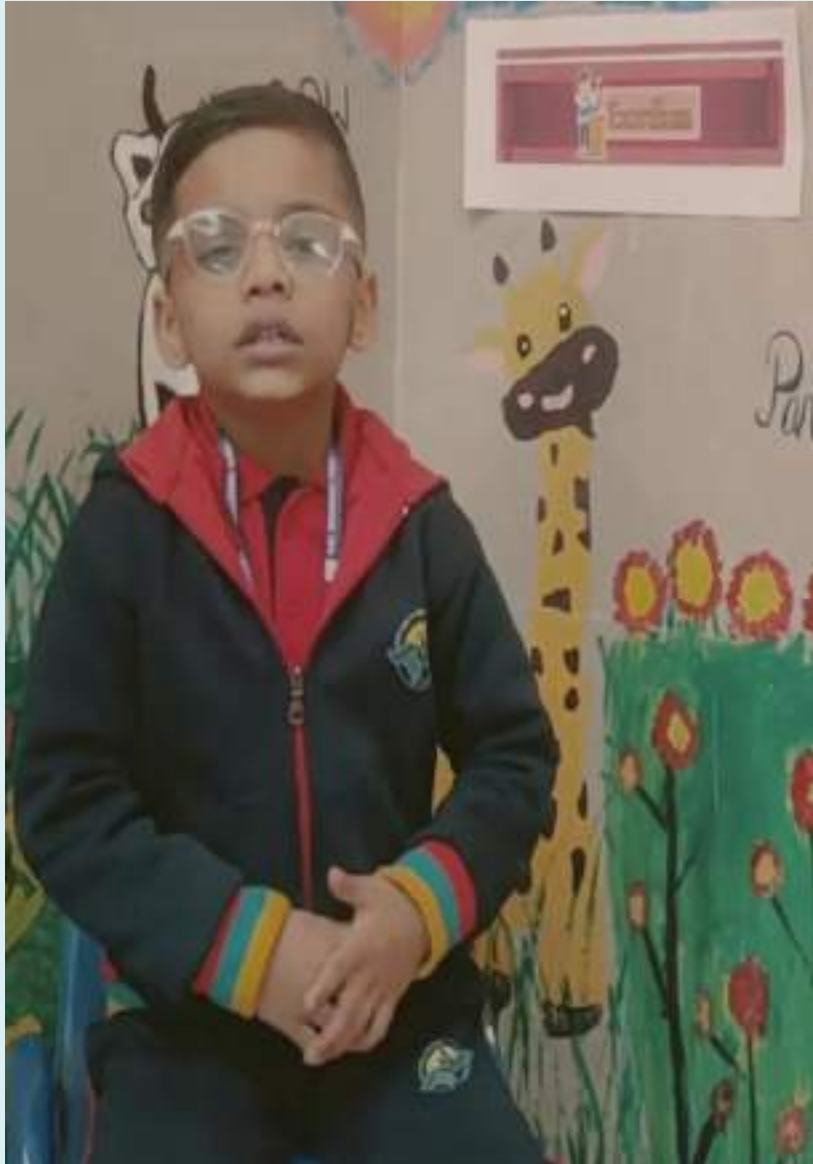

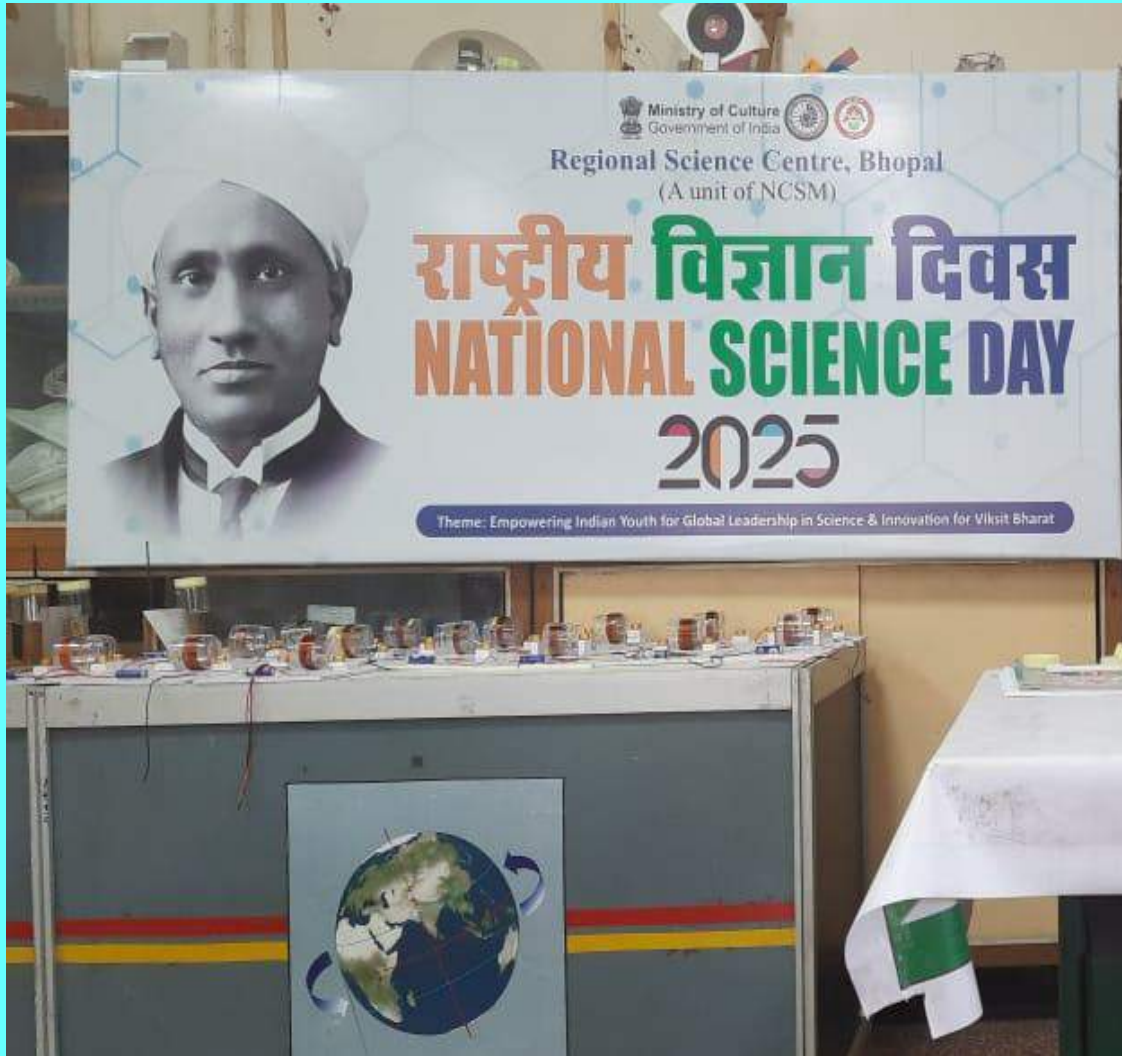


FOR TEACHERS

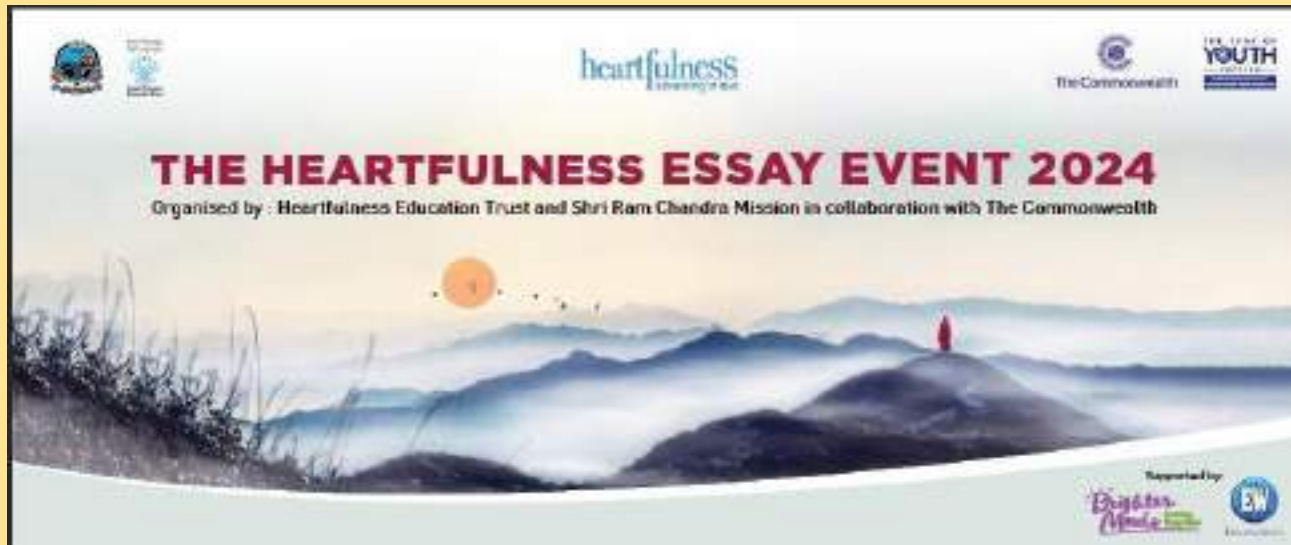




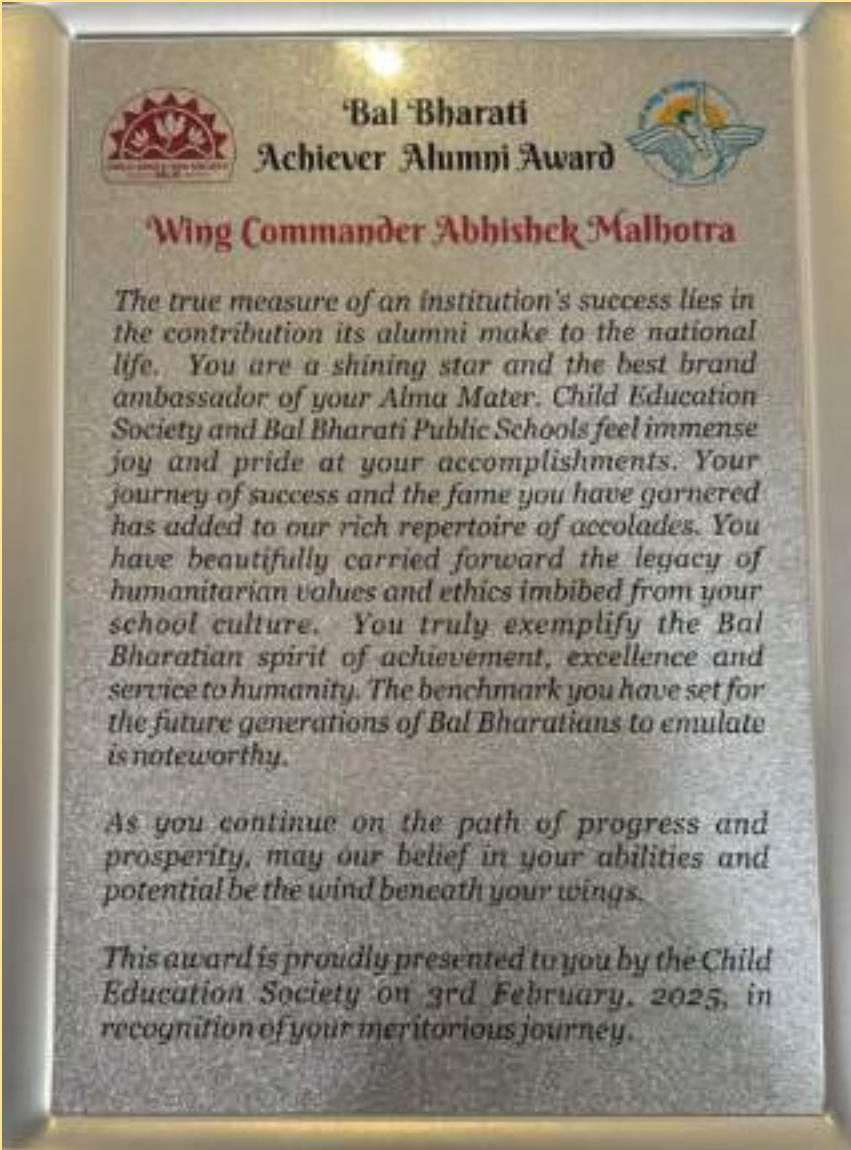

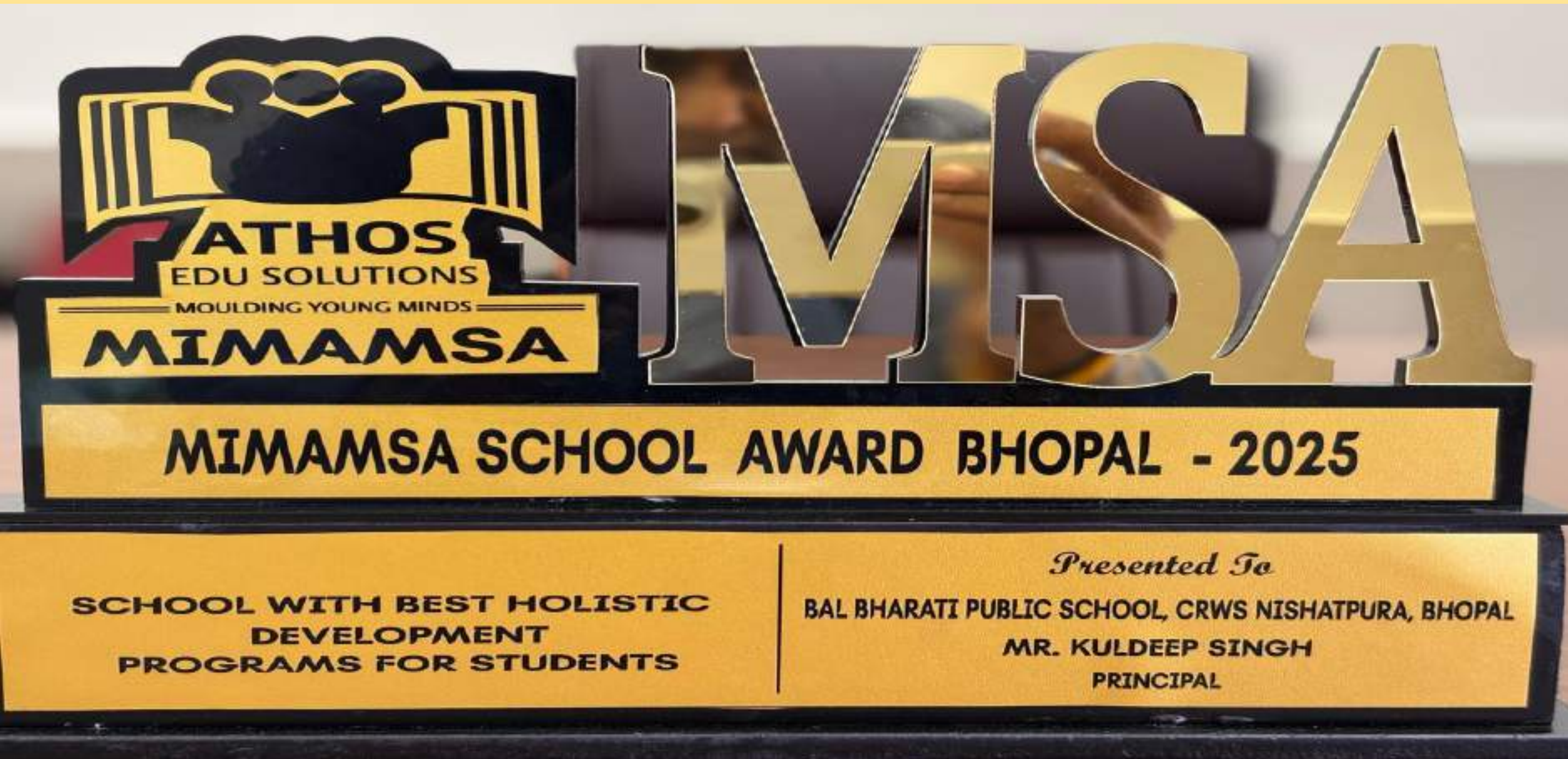

The school Management and leadership engages in monthly review of certain areas of school policies and practices and their impact on various areas of the functioning of the school. All compliance are strictly adhered to.






