The school has 1136 students of which the wards of Railway employees are 627, 425 students are of Non-Railway wards and 12 are staff wards. Also, the school caters to the education of 72 EWS students under the RTE Act. 08 seats have been reserved for admission of students to be admitted under the RTE Act.

- Classes I to V had their 2nd Block Test beginning from 26 September to 5 October 2020 and classes VI to XII had their 2nd Unit Test from 19 to 25 September 2020.

The online exams were conducted in three parts, Objective Assessment, Subjective Assessment and Oral Assessment. Google form and Google classroom have proved to be effective tools.

PTM for classes I to V was scheduled on 18 October and for classes VI to XII was on 22 October 2020.

- **Monthly Assignments-** With a view to recapitulate the lessons taught, assignments are given to all the students of Classes I to XII through Google Classrooms.
- **The Registration and LOC of Classes IX & XI students and Classes X & XII students have been finalized and submitted to CBSE.**
- **The Online Time Table** is being strictly adhered to.
- **Online Remedial Classes** for the slow learners of Classes X and XII are underway.
- **Virtual Class Observation.** In order to improve the teaching-learning process, classes are being observed on a regular basis by the Principal.

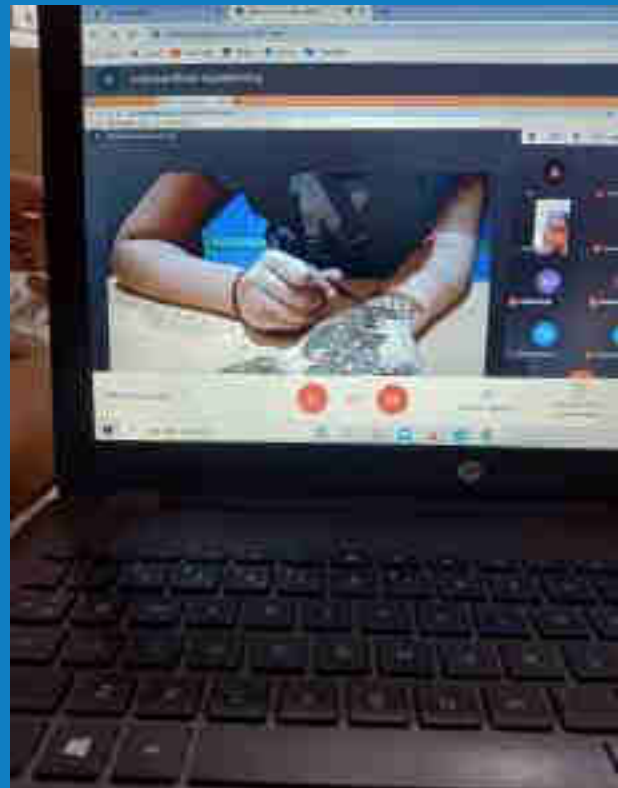

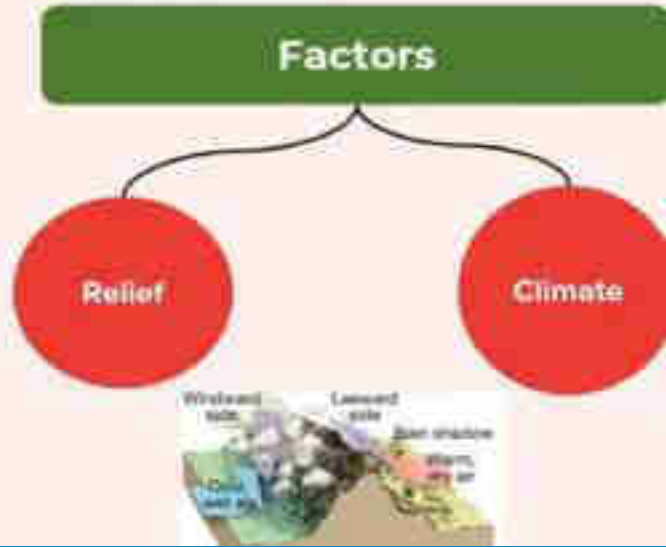

Tropical Deciduous Forests

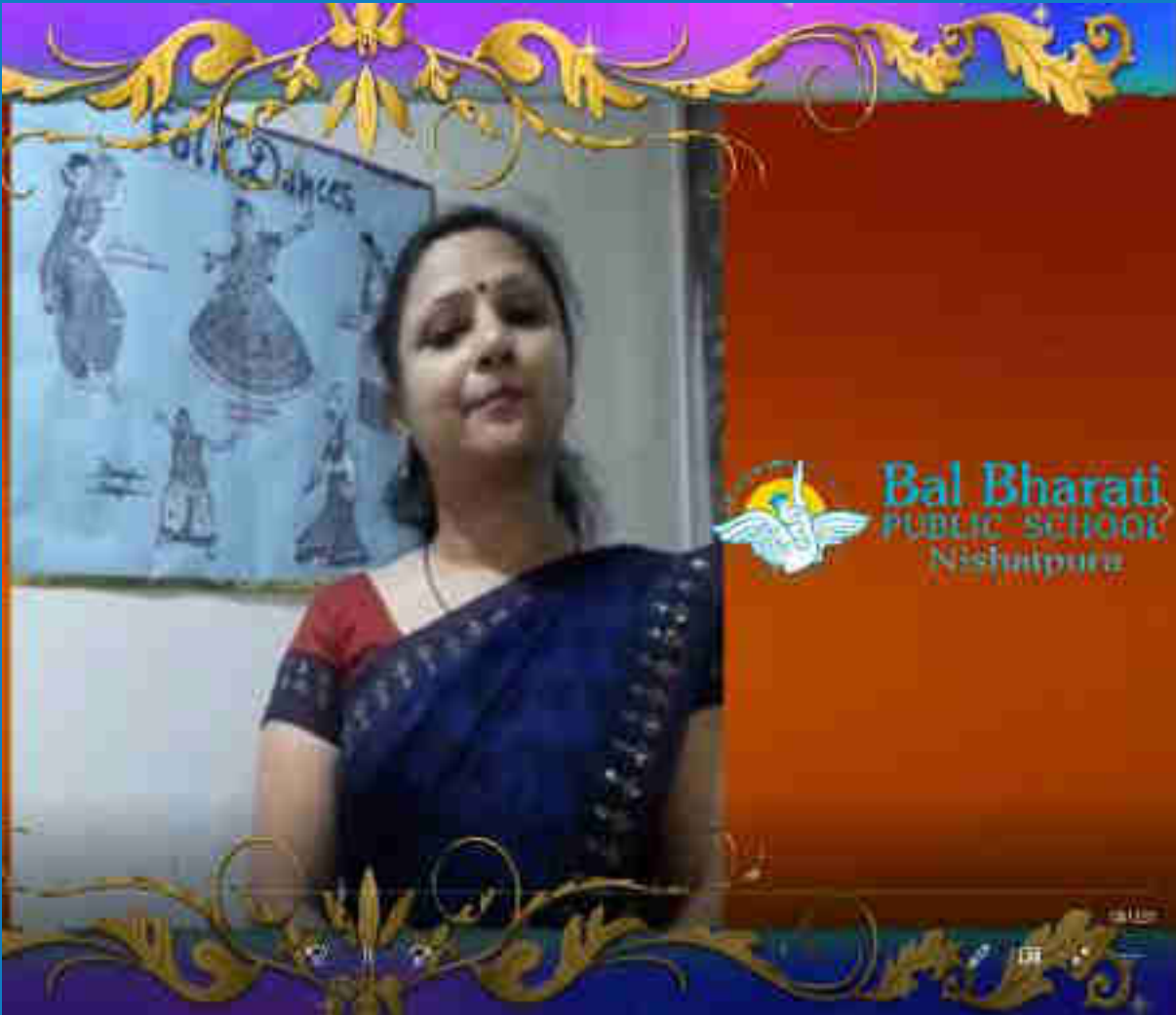
- Most widespread forests of India & called the monsoon forests.

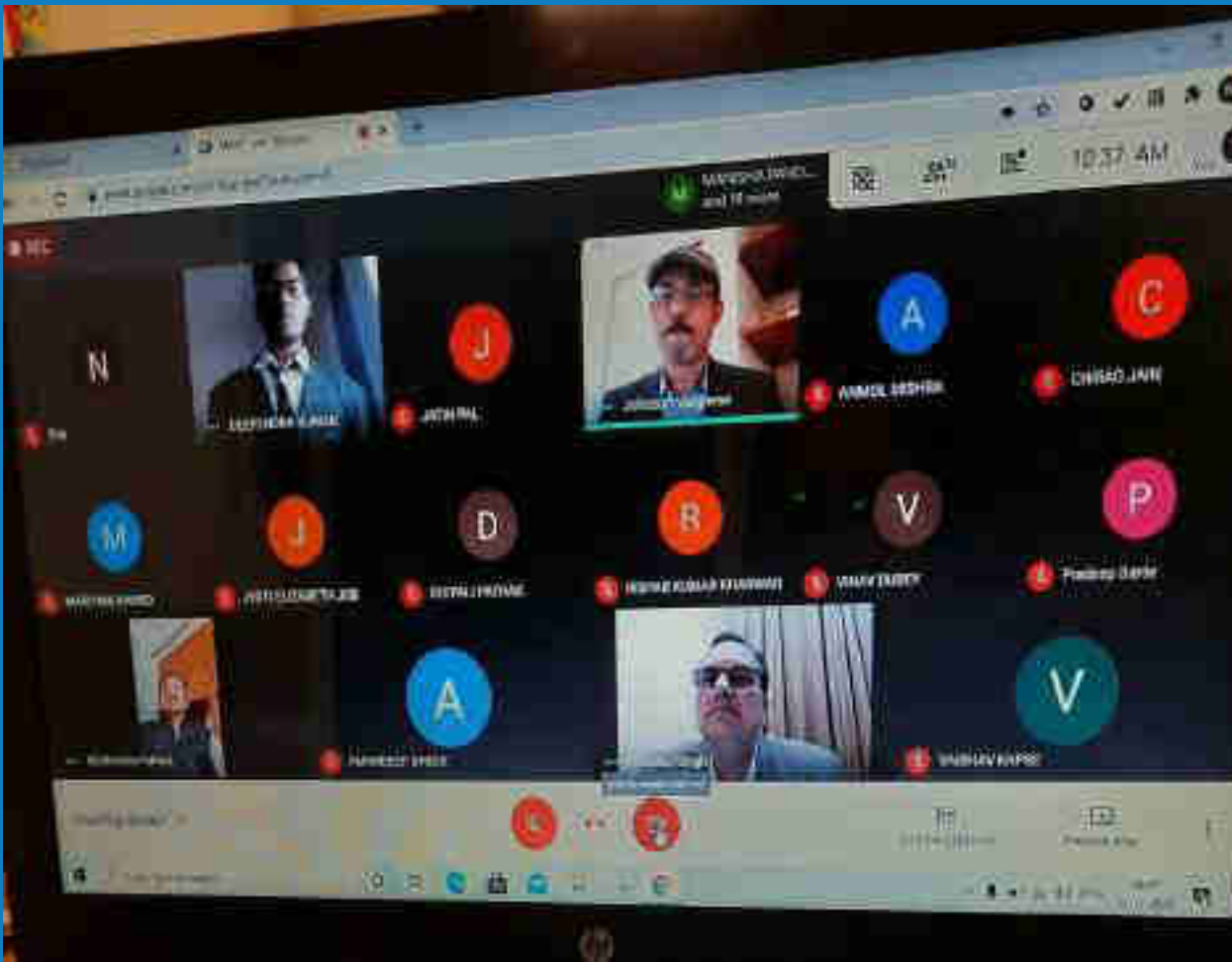

On the occasion, the students presented dance performances and delivered speeches to symbolize the festival of lights.



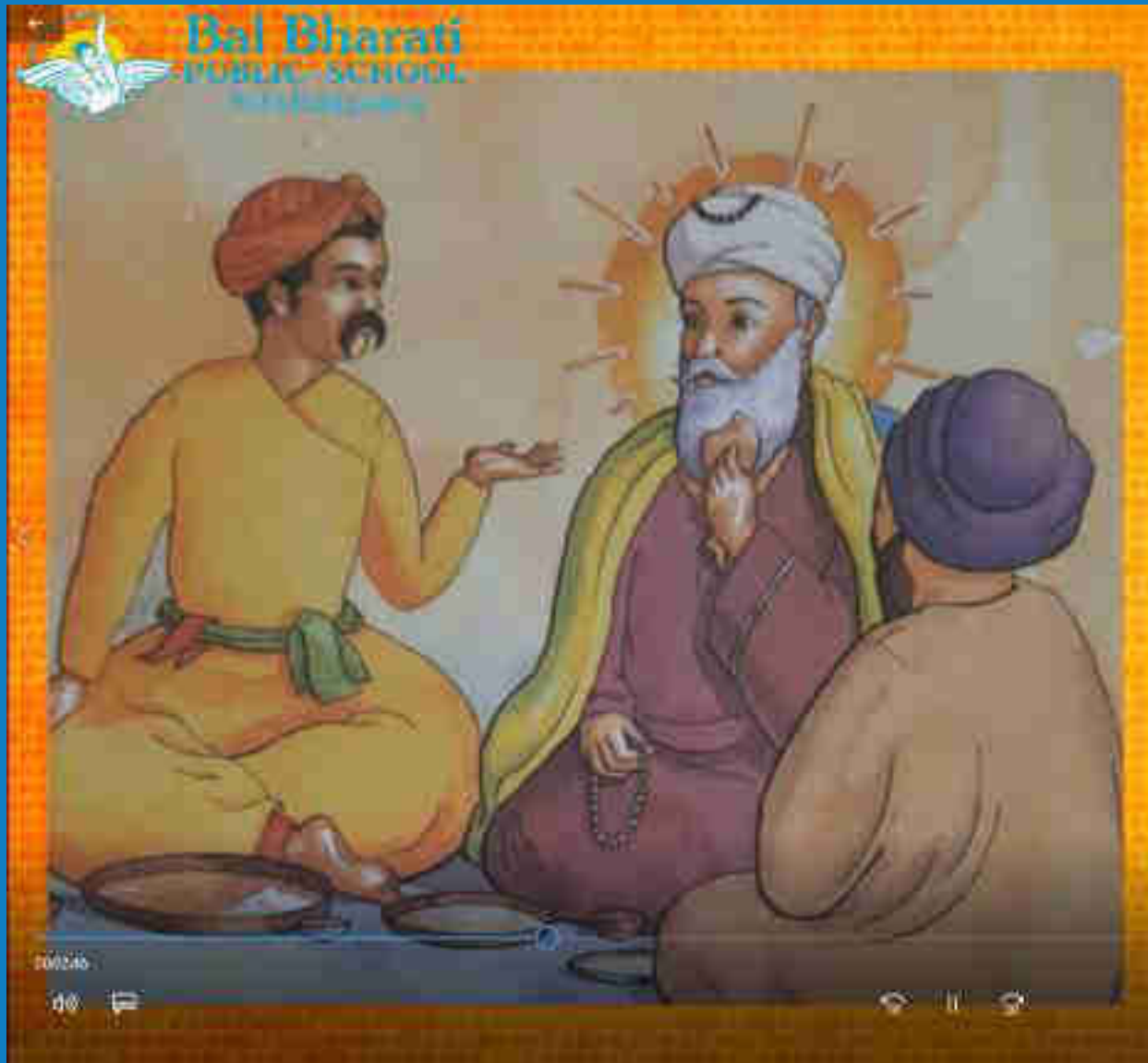

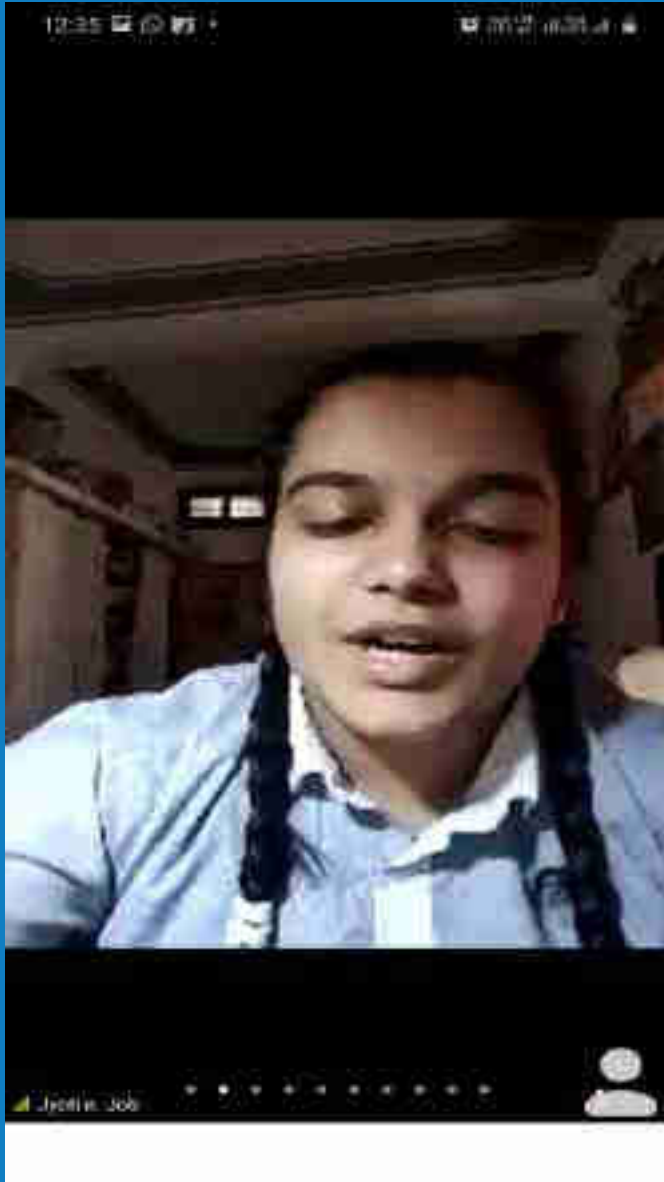

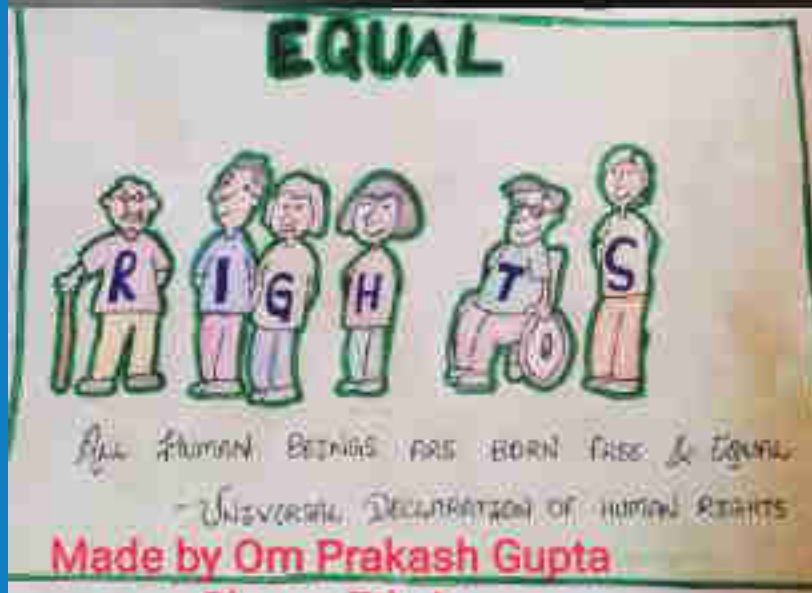
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The e-certificates for the listed Workshops and Seminars are available on School website.

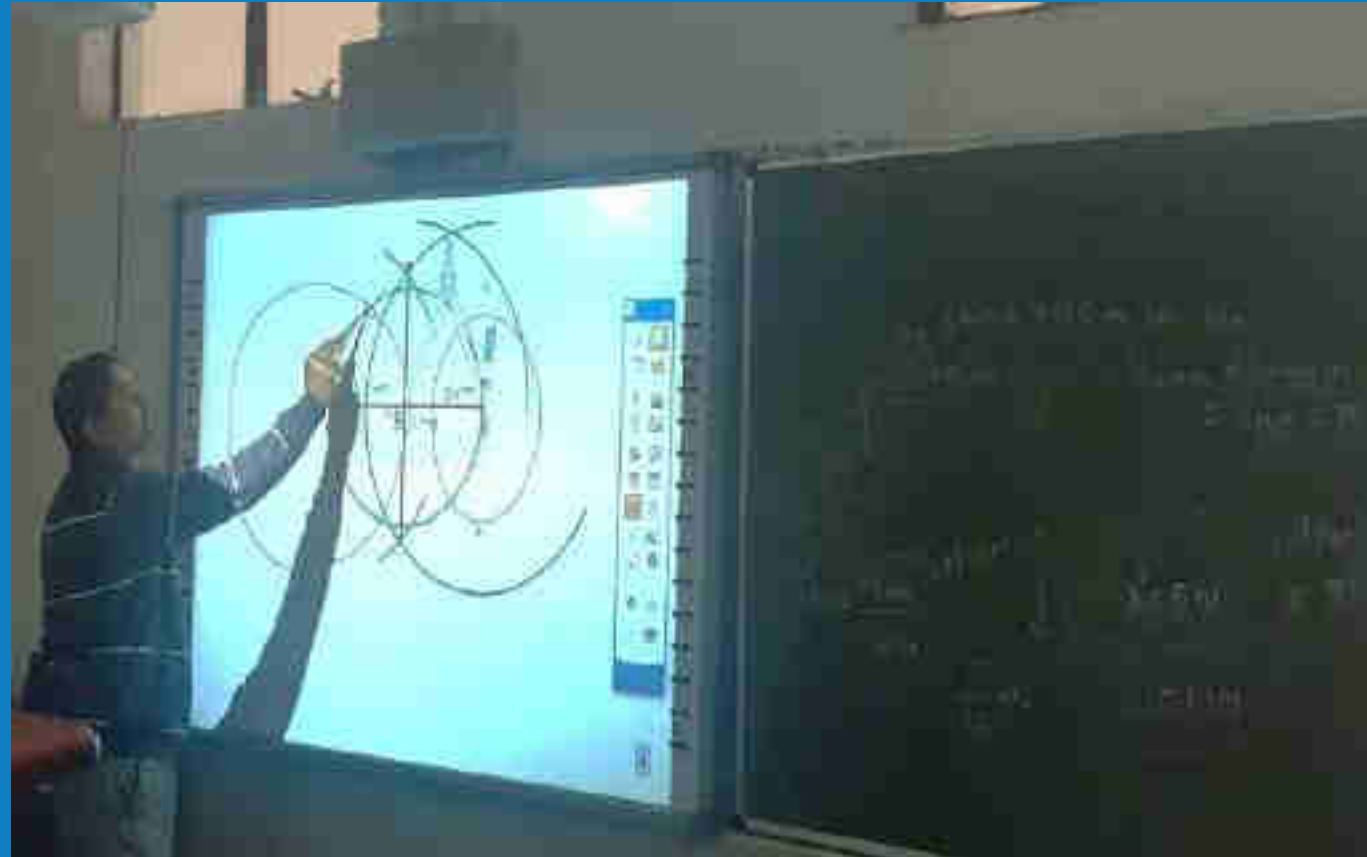


No civil works are being carried out by the Railways in the school during the period under report.

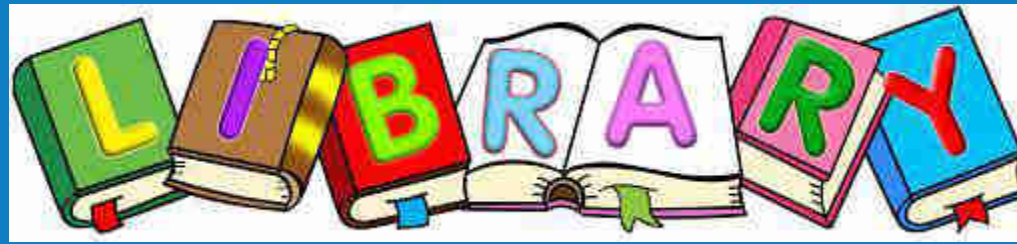
SECURITY

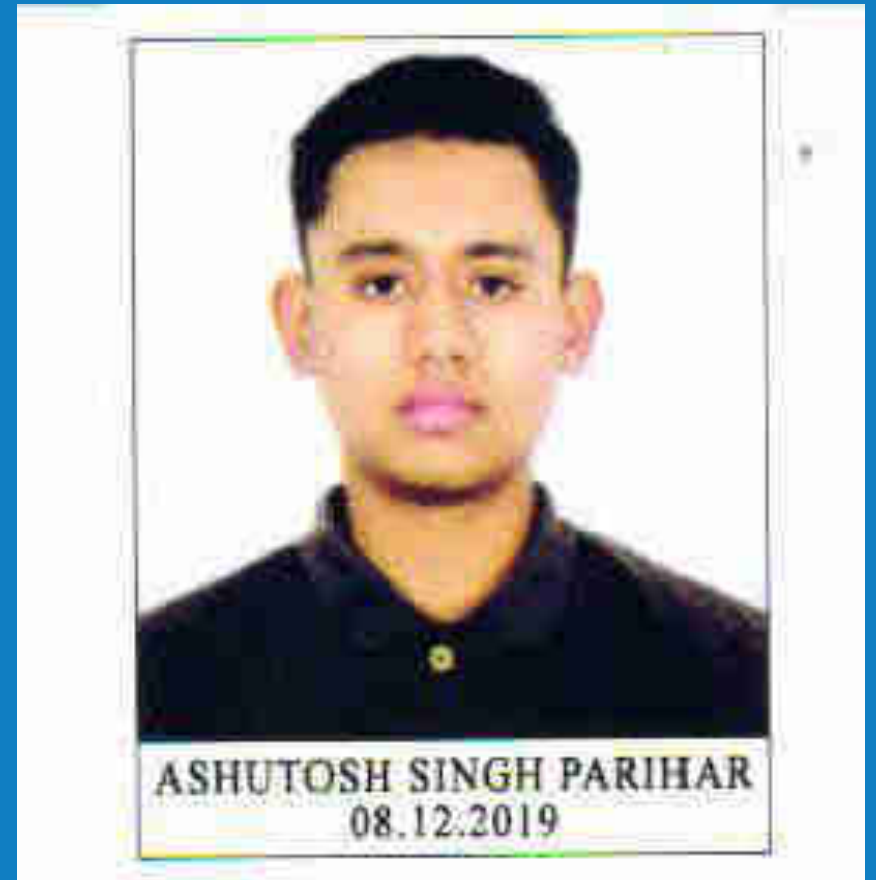

A virtual tour was organised on 25 November to the city library. Students of classes VI and VIII attended the same.

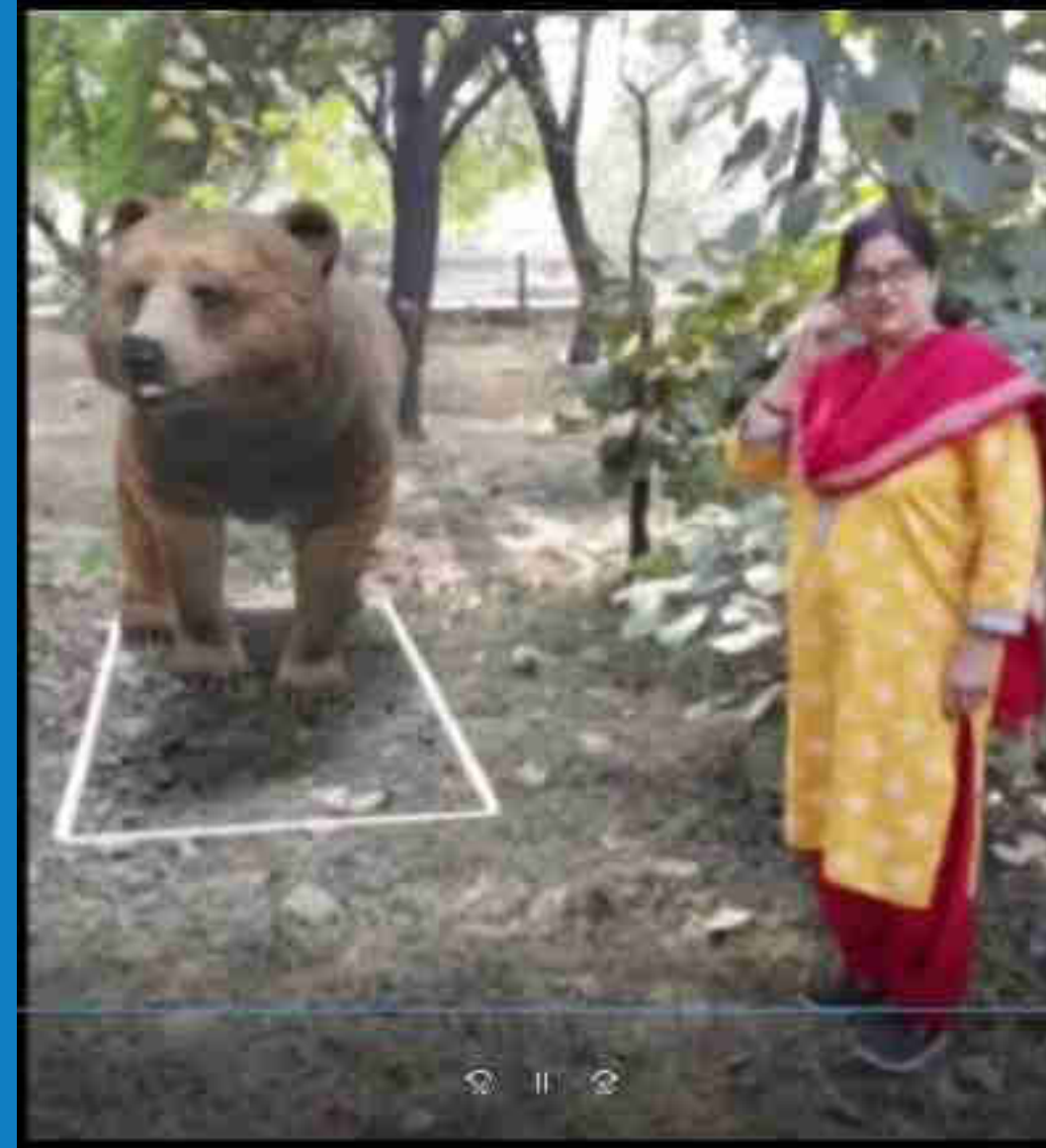


Virtual Tour to Kanha National Park, Balaghat District, M.P.
